

## **Dr. Roger Koranteng - Biography**

Dr. Roger Koranteng is the Adviser and Head, Public Sector Governance, for the Commonwealth Secretariat, making him the principal specialist responsible for the Public Sector Governance and Anti-Corruption at the Commonwealth Secretariat. His responsibilities include the governance, anti-corruption, and democratic and oversight institutions in all the 53 commonwealth countries.

Having established the vibrant Association of Anti-Corruption Agencies in Commonwealth Africa and the Caribbean, he conceived, midwifed and operationalised the Commonwealth Africa Anti-Corruption Centre in Botswana as a partnership between the Commonwealth Secretariat and Botswana Government. He also partnered with Grenada Integrity Commission and Department of Public Administration to establish a Regional Training Centre of Excellence in Grenada. Based on his impactful work over the years, Roger has been chosen as a winner of the 2018 Sheik Tamim Bin Hamad Al Thani International Anti-Corruption Excellence Award.

Dr. Koranteng holds a PhD (Public Policy) from University of Birmingham, UK; an MA (Public Policy & Administration) from the Institute of Social Studies, the Hague, Netherlands; a Post-Graduate Diploma in Public Administration from GIMPA, Ghana; a Post-Graduate Diploma in Environmental Studies from the University of Oslo, Norway; and a BA (Hons.) from the University of Ghana, Legon. Dr. Koranteng has published extensively on Governance and Anti-Corruption and has taken numerous assignments around the world. He has also worked as a facilitator and lecturer.
