

**The Commonwealth Caribbean Association of Integrity Commissions and Anti-Corruption Bodies Issues its Communiqué from its Recent Conference**

The 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Conference of the Commonwealth Caribbean Association of Integrity Commissions and Anti-Corruption Bodies (CCAICACB) was held in the Cayman Islands from 3 – 7 June 2019 at the Marriott Beach Resort.

Sponsored by the Commission for Standards in Public Life, the Cayman Islands Government, the Commonwealth Fund for Technical Co-operation and the Commonwealth Secretariat, delegates from 10 countries within the region participated in the Conference under the theme “*Transforming Words into Action: Revitalising the Fight Against Corruption*”.

The Opening Ceremony kicked off the Conference, where the Secretary-General for the Commonwealth Secretariat, the Rt. Hon. Patricia Scotland QC, delivered the keynote address and H.E. the Governor, Mr. Martyn Roper OBE, formally declared the Conference open.

The Conference agenda featured four international speakers from the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime, Jamaica’s National Integrity Action anti-corruption non-profit, the Robert H. Smith School of Business at the University of Maryland in the US and the Commonwealth Secretariat. Five panel discussions with panellists comprised of local and international subject experts rounded out the agenda. Delegates also had the opportunity to share the latest updates and best practices from their respective countries, and to learn from each of their struggles and successes.

The Conference wrapped up with an Annual General Meeting of the CCAICACB on 7 June 2019 resulting in the issue of the attached Communiqué.
